League members visited with the Sisterhood Club at Hempfield High School to discuss the history of the League, explain the structure of our local government, and emphasize why municipal elections matter.

Our Voter Services Chair, Sarah, has secured grant money for educational initiatives. She also coordinated many opportunities for Voter Education and Registration events including Open Streets Lancaster. With events planned all summer, we hope our members will consider an hour or two of volunteer work so that we can keep the momentum going.

Our League is becoming more visible in the community. Engagement creates energy, networking expands our reach, and we look forward to partnering with likeminded nonpartisan organizations as we concentrate on building our own membership.

## 2023 LEGISLATIVE INTERVIEWS

Every year, the League of Women Voters takes time to interview their state legislators or staff. Legislative interviews are a powerful tool - increasing League visibility, gathering information, and raising awareness among Lancaster County state representatives about our interest in policies they are considering. Legislative interviews are an opportunity for legislators to share their priorities with local Leagues and develop an understanding of League positions and priorities. Leagues discover plans for state legislation that may impact their communities. Furthermore, the state League learns more about legislators and the interests of local Leagues, gaining information useful in planning statewide advocacy and education. Here is a recap of recent sessions:

On March 4<sup>th</sup>, LWV of Lancaster County members Paula Koda and Jeri Stelson Weaver had a great "Meet & Greet" with Rep Bryan Cutler yesterday to discuss the League and Rep Cutler's plans for the current legislative session. We appreciate Rep Cutler's willingness to meet with us and enjoyed the productive discussion.

On March 31<sup>st</sup>, LWVLC representatives Lauren Shaw and Carolyn Hernandez met with Representative Brett Miller of the 41<sup>st</sup> district. While Rep Miller was not inclined to pose for a photo, he provided a great deal of time and information to the League about this over all priorities to "serve the people" and the bills he is working on.

On April 10<sup>th</sup>, LWVLC representatives Sarah Zeiders and Carolyn Hernandez had the opportunity to "Meet & Greet" freshman Representative Tom Jones of the 98th District today. It was a productive and enjoyable discussion about his priorities for the upcoming legislative session. We appreciated his time and candidness!

And, on April 28<sup>th</sup>, League members Amy Fasano and Shannon Taggart met with Representative Mike Sturla from the 96th District as well as his office director, Francis Milano. We learned about Rep. Sturla's work as Majority Chair of the Housing and Community Development Committee, his work on the Education Funding (Fair Funding) Committee and his sponsorship of HB20 that aims to improve water quality here in Lancaster and ultimately, in the Chesapeake Bay. Rep. Sturla mentioned concerns from his newer constituents in Manheim Township include traffic issues.



We discussed the impact that young voters have today. We were thrilled that eligible voters were registered and had a plan to vote! Great discussion and questions with the Sisterhood Club!





In April 2023, the LWVLC invited nearly 400 candidates across over 200 races to complete their profile on



Vote411.org. Candidates were asked to share basic profile information as well as answer questions that related to the specific public office that they are seeking.

The address-based system allowed voters are then able to enter their address to view their individual ballot, learn more about candidates and become more informed with their vote.

The LWVLC saw a 25% response rate from candidates and we are hopeful that we can engage more candidates ahead of the general election in November.
